As paving occurs in your neighborhood, please remember it is very important to stay off the street until the contractor opens it up again. Parking will be restricted. Please watch for additional notices to come.

When installed, asphalt is approximately 300 degrees and can take several hours to cool to a safe temperature. Also, keep pets and children away from the asphalt as it could cause serious injury.

Important Information:

Work zones have many moving parts including, flaggers, reduced speed limits, no parking zones and lane restrictions which all create the need for motorists to be aware of their surroundings to prevent accidents. The DrivingChange team reminds motorists to slow down in work zones.

- Watch for signage to direct you through the construction zone
- Always be on high alert for construction traffic through the area
- Avoid distractions and drive slow
- Follow flaggers' instructions

The DrivingChange team reminds residents to shut off their irrigation system when construction work is located near their home. If damage occurs to a resident's sprinkler system due to DrivingChange construction work, the contractor will be returning within two weeks to repair the damage.
